About the Author

Nancy was born and raised in the "garden of England" (southeast part south of the River Thames, where all the fruit and flowers are grown). She was attending King's College, London University when the war broke out in 1939 and was called to active duty in the Women's Army, manning anti-aircraft guns defending London. In 1942 she was assigned to work with the US Air Force in England. When war ended, Nancy served as a court reporter at the Nuremberg War Crimes Trials, and later came to the US and married Colonel H. R. Kenaston who was Command Judge Advocate at Eglin AFB. She has been here ever since.

Nancy worked at the Daily News for several years, serving as Editor during transition from a weekly to a daily newspaper. She also served as legislative Aide to State Rep. Jerry Melvin for four years.

Nancy is the author of several history books, including "From Cabin to Campus", story of the Okaloosa School System.
